CURRENT INTEROPERABILITY PROGRAMS - WHY



BHQIP

The CalAIM Behavioral Health Quality Improvement Program (BHQIP) is an incentive payment program to support Mental Health Plans (MHP), Drug Medi-Cal State Plans (DMC) and Drug Medi-Cal Organized Delivery Systems. Requirements include the implementation and active exchange of FHIR transactions.

CMS Interoperability

The rule emphasizes the need to improve health information exchange to achieve appropriate and necessary access to complete health records for patients, health care providers, and payers. The ruling calls for specific, open-access, API-based interfaces for patients, and other payers.

Data Archive*

*You can participate in only the Data Archive. However, you CANNOT Participate in Interoperability without participating in Data Archive as well.

Benefit: By Combining Data Archive with Interoperability, Prop 30 funding may help offset archive cost.

California DxF

The Data Exchange Framework includes a single data sharing agreement and common set of policies and procedures that will govern and require the exchange of health information among health care entities and government entities in California through DxF & at a Federal Level through TEFCA

HIE

CalMHSA will be an HIE organization and a member of CA HIE and the CTEN and stand as a technical solution to facilitate all levels of interoperability for its members.





WHAT ARE THE POTENTIAL PENALTIES?



BHQIP

You are ineligible to receive BHQIP incentive funding.

CMS Interoperability

- Beginning in 2025, corrective action plans may be imposed.
- Beginning in 2025
 administrative and/or
 monetary sanctions for non compliance may be
 imposed.
- These sanctions may include but not be limited to the loss of Medicare funding & MediCal funding as referenced by BHIN 023-032

California DxF

Potential non-compliance and exposure to any applicable penalties or sanctions as it relates to FEDERAL INFORMATION BLOCKING REGULATIONS as referenced by DxF P&P OPP-10

Interoperability Solution Pricing



SMALL COUNTY

One-Time Implementation \$100,000

Annual Cost \$39,000

MEDIUM COUNTY

One-Time Implementation \$150,000

Annual Cost \$63,000

LARGE COUNTY

One-Time Implementation \$250,000

Annual Cost \$105,000

Potential Funding Opportunities



California DxF TA Grant

One-Time \$50k Per County

Application Deadline 10/16-12/16 2023

- The Center for Data Insights and Innovation (CDII) is currently offering funding to assist organizations with meeting DxF requirements. - 25k
 Baseline & \$25k additional for enhanced
 - CalMHSA would apply on your behalf as an umbrella applicant.
 CalMHSA will manage the application process and work with
 CDII
 - \$50K total (\$25K baseline and an additional \$25K of enhanced funding) is available to county applicants.

Prop 30 Funding

State 50% of 1st Year Cost

Federal 25% of 1st Year Cost

- Prop 30 State, the total Performance Outcome Systems (POS) hardware and software upgrade expenditures incurred for each program (MCHIP and other Medi-Cal Specialty Mental Health Program). The State May Reimburse Up to 50% of non-federal share.
- Prop 30 Federal, the total Federal Medicaid Managed Care Final Rule and Parity Rule administrative costs incurred for each program (MCHIP and other Medi-Cal Specialty Mental Health Program). The non-federal share is shared between the County and DHCS.
